This term we are going to look at poetry and stories. Through poetry we will describe animals using adjectives and rhyming. We will retell the story of 'Tiger Dead', changing the characters to make the story our own.

Rocks

This term, our scientific investigations will focus on 'rocks and fossils'. We will examine different types of rocks and identify suitable uses for them based on their properties. We will also begin to look at the different types of fossils and develop an understanding as to how they are formed.

The Stone Age



This term, we will be exploring the Stone Age period and will be focusing on aspects of 'Early Mans' everyday life. We will examine the types of homes that they built, the simple clothes that they wore and the tools that they made. We will also look at early Stone Age settlements and make comparisons to our own, modern day lives.

Maths

This term we will continue to deepen our understanding of place value and number by focusing on word problems and maths investigations. We will also revisit shapes and build on our understanding of angles and parallel and perpendicular lines when looking at regular and irregular shapes.



Cave Art

This term we will be looking at cave art, considering the methods used to paint the images and the shapes that are made.

We will then compare cave paintings to modern murals that we can find in our local community.
