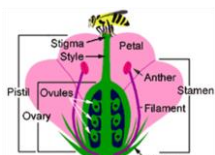

Canterbury

We will be learning about the city of Canterbury in both Geography and History this term. We begin by looking at maps of Canterbury and will create our own sketch maps from aerial photography. In History, we will learn about the life and death of Thomas Beckett and the significance this has to the city.



Science: Living things and their habitats
